Can you believe we are less than 3 months away from our next competition? The November competition will, again, but only digital, but we are working on a solution for prints next May if we are still having virtual judging.

The November competition is exciting — we have a new category in the special open theme — sunrises and sunset. In this day and age of sky replacements and composites, I was asked an interesting question - If I have a picture with a foreground that I like, can I replace the sky with someone else's sunrise or sunset and submit the image in the sunrise/sunset category. The category is an open category.

This question made us rethink our definition of sunrise/sunset for the purposes of the competition. The definition is:

Sunrise/Sunset

The time of day one hour before and after the sun touches the horizon. Since this is an open category, the Hand of Man is allowed in the image. No sky replacement is allowed, all of the image must be the photographer's own image.

If you have any questions on this definition and what may or may not be allowed for this category, please feel free to reach out to me (preferably before you submit the image in question to the competition).

As long as we're talking about the competition, we have a couple other ideas for new categories that you will see pop up from time to time, but if you have any ideas for categories that you would like to see, let me know what those are and the committee will talk about incorporating them into the rotation.

I'm saving the best for last.....we have decided to change the Best of Show plaque. More on that later, but trust me — you're going to want to bring your A game to the competition to win one of these!

Nature Special Open Theme – Natural Landscape

Subject matter is a landscape image that does not rely on closeup detail to impart the nature story. Images that include roads, fences, mowed or cultivated fields, or any other human element are not allowed.

The appearance of the "Hand of Man" is prohibited. The subject should not be moved to a studio environment but should be depicted in its natural surroundings. No mounted subjects are allowed. Furthermore, no manipulation is allowed except for cropping, exposure adjustments and dust sensor removal. No cloning to add or delete elements to the composition is allowed.

Random Open Special Theme - Sunrise/Sunset

The time of day one hour before and after the sun touches the horizon. Since this is an open category, the Hand of Man is allowed in the image. No sky replacement is allowed, all of the image must be the photographer's own image.

How the Fall Competition Will be Judged

(Virtual Judging)

Virtual judging for us is pretty easy since both Ken Warning and I have had to do this for other PSA groups. Here is what we will do. We first gathered all the images and the score sheets for the projected competition. We have three judges (One is the Best of Show winner from Spring). We will send the judges the images and the score sheets. They go through the images independent of each other and scored all the photos. They then send Ken the score sheets, and he tallies the scores for all six sections and enters the scores into our judging software. The higher scoring images will then be selected using the same procedures as all previous competitions for judging the medal awards. (14 & 15's or 13 & 14's). Using the same software as we always have done, we will show the images in a Zoom webinar, so all three judges could converse and pick out the 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place. Once they did all that, we took all the 1st place images and showed them to the judges, and they picked the Best of Show.

This Fall, we plan on letting people observe the final part of the judging. We will be allowing up to 90 people who will see the last part of the judging. We will set up an Eventbrite sign-up and you may sign-up to watch the final part of the judging, this will be free, and you will be able to observe the final process. We also plan on putting up the final judging onto our website. Here is the link to sign up to watch the final judging.

The competition will be the same as when we do it with people watching, except seeing all the images for the first round of judging, this is done ahead of time since we don't have an easy way to show that part of it.

So get your images ready for the Fall competition, we hope you enjoy watching the final stages of judging.

PSA Councils Challenge Results

The PSA Councils Challenge results are in, and we did pretty well this year. This year there were thirteen councils throughout the United States competing. There are three different divisions that each council enters. Color Open, Nature, and Monochrome Open. Each council enters ten images from 10 different makers in each division. Images are selected from the Spring and Fall WACCO competition from the previous year.


WACCO came in 4th place overall beating out Chicago Area Camera Clubs Association. We came in 2nd place in Nature division, beating out the Southern California Council and Chicago Area Camera Clubs Association (both are very active councils in competition). In the Color Open division, we tied for 2nd place with Southern California Council of Camera Clubs. Finally, in the Monochrome Open division, we came in 10th place.

Eight of our images out of 30 won an Honorable Mention award, and one person won 3rd place in the Nature section for Calliope Hummer by Kris Weltzien. You can see her image on the front page of this newsletter. The Honorable mention images are on page 7.

Digital Forum - The Meeting

The Digital Forum newsletter came from the original Digital Forum educational meeting that Lynn Reiger originally started a long time ago. For a while, it was held in New Berlin in the basement of a bank. It later moved to the Menomonee Falls Public Library. We meet once



a month, and it was a two-hour educational meeting, usually on some processing program as Adobe Elements. We added Photoshop, and then it became just an informative couple of hours. We would sometime have special guests come in and do a talk or two.

I am going to bring the Digital Forum back. It will be an educational type of program, but it will be a virtual program. Being virtual will give us a lot more benefits; we will bring in speakers from different parts of the state. We will be able to have people across the state attend the meetings.

I plan to lead the meeting, but it will also be up to those who attend the meeting to ask questions and others to help answer the group's questions. We will talk about equipment, programs, different techniques, anything that may help you expand your knowledge of photography. It will be a wide variety of topics from Drone photography, still, nature, landscape, architectural, and Sports Photography. There are many photographers out there with a vast range of knowledge that, hopefully, they will share.

The current plan for the Digital Forum will be a two-hour meeting. It will be held on the 4th Saturday of the month, and it will be from 10:00 AM till Noon. I have picked this time because of a couple of factors, from what I can tell no clubs are meeting at that time, and 10:00 AM until Noon is a terrible time to take photographs. I am also looking at a possible 2nd time which would be the 4th Monday of the month from 7:00 PM till 9:00 PM. I plan to start with just the Saturday meeting, and if I see enough interest, I may add the 4th Monday night.

I will be starting the meetings in September on the 24th at 10:00 AM. We will have room for up to 100 people

that will be able to attend the meeting. There will be no cost in attending this virtual meeting. I plan to send out to everyone on the WACCO mailing list an invite to the meeting. There will be need to be a registration for everyone to sign up; that way, you will be sent a link to the meeting. Do not pass this link around; it will be for you individually; please send people to the link below so that they can get their own link.

This Zoom system we will be using is their webinar meeting. So it will be a little different than a regular Zoom meeting. There will be two types of attendees; one will be a Panelist, they will need good sound and a webcam, they will be able to participate as in a regular Zoom meeting, it has a limit of 48 people. Then there will be attendees who will watch from their devices and ask questions using the Q & A section. The people that will be panelists will need to arrive a little early, and it will be a first-come opportunity.

On-Page 9, there is an article about equipment that you need to participate in a Zoom meeting. We would like you to have good sound and video; we need participation from those who attend.

What You Need to Participate in a Zoom (virtual) Meeting

Since many camera clubs are going to Zoom or virtual meetings, I thought I would give some pointers to what you will need so that you can participate. This will make the meeting more like a regular camera club meeting.

You will need four items: first would be a microphone, either one that is built into your laptop computer, built into your tablet or phone. If you don't have a microphone in any of these, you can get a USB microphone that would plug into your computer. This will let you give input during the meeting. There are a variety of microphones that you can get at a range of prices. (Below are some examples of tested microphones that work well)

Depending on the microphone, you may need a USB connector to get the microphone into the computer. Sound is pretty essential, lousy sound makes the meeting hard to understand, but it does not take a lot of money to get a good sound, generally about \$20 to \$100.



The second item that will make the meeting go better is a set of headphones, you can use the speakers on your computer, but that can give some feedback problems. The easiest way around that is to use a set of headphones plugged into your computer, I use an inexpensive one made by MEE, they run about \$19, and they will improve the sound for everyone if you can use headphones, so please if you can use some headphones.

With having a good microphone on your computer, you can view the meeting with the computer, and you don't really need a camera to show your face. It is helpful if you have a webcam to show your image, this will make it a little more personable at the meeting and make it more like a regular camera club meeting. So a good webcam is needed, the one that I would recommend is a Logitech C920 for about \$80. The big problem right now is that they are always back-ordered and take a few months. You can search out various webcams from Adorama or B & H Photo, and you might be able to get one quicker. The camera should capture 1080p image quality to get a


and comfort

good sharp image. Another way to go is to use a capture card made by Elgato that costs about \$130. That will let you use one of your DSLR or Mirror-less camera. A couple of things to watch out for is that you need a clean HDMI out and that some cameras will time out after 30 minutes, most Sony and Nikon mirror-less cameras will give clean HDMI, and they don't have the 30-minute problem.





One last item that may or may not be needed is additional light, if your room lights are bright, you should have not problem using the webcam, but if your room is dark, you might want some extra lights lighting up your face. I recommend this ring light, you can put your camera right in the middle of the ring light and you will get good illumination on your face.



Once you have a microphone, earphone, light and webcam, you are set for the meeting. Here is some help for logging in to the meeting. For Zoom only, there are many other virtual meetings, but Zoom is the easiest to use, so that is what we are using.

Signing In to a Meeting

You will get an invitation to the meeting from whomever is hosting the event. If you click on the link, it will open up a browser window, and then it will ask you to go to the Zoom app. So it is a good idea to download the Zoom app and to register for the free account. This just makes it easier to get going for Zoom. There are also phone numbers you can use to dial in using a regular phone not a smart phone. I would also suggest getting the Zoom app for your tablet or a mobile (smart) phone; just remember that it will be using data on your phone, and Zoom will use a lot of data.

Once you click on the link and are in the Zoom App, you will be placed in a waiting room, and the Host will let you in once they are ready. When you are in the meeting, please keep yourself muted for the audio, this keeps the background noises from distracting everyone. When you want to speak, you can hold down the space bar or click the microphone that will be red with a slash through it to show you are muted, click on that to be unmuted for more extended periods. When you are not talking, keep yourself muted to not distract the other people in the meeting.

Showing Images

If you want to show images at a meeting, there are a couple of ways to do this. First, find out ahead of time if the Host wants

you to send the images to them in advance of the meeting. Usually, if they do, you have several different ways to send the images, one is Dropbox, the other is www.wetransfer.com. Collect the images, put them into a folder, and

either send them by www.wetransfer.com or ask the Host to give you a Dropbox link to upload the file to them. If the Host wants you to share the images yourself, you can do it through the Zoom app. Click the green share screen button

on the bottom of the screen to bring a dialog box up, click the Desktop button, and then check the share computer sound and optimize screen checkboxes. If it is a movie, have it loaded up ready to

run, it will also show up on that dialogue box, so click on that instead of the desktop. Then click share, and you should be ready to go.



LEARN LIGHT AND SC!!ND

Here are a few final tips for a meeting. Raise your physical hand to ask a question and wait for the Host to call on you, this keeps the meeting organized, no one can hear you if you talk over someone else. If you don't have video, then raise your zoom hand, or sometimes there will be a Q & A section or a chat section to ask questions.

Please use your real name when in a meeting; the Host needs to make sure who is attending the meeting. You can rename yourself at the meeting by clicking on Participants, finding your current name, and clicking on it.

Finally, be polite to everyone, no swearing or foul language, or politics we want to keep a clean meeting as if we are in public, it is easy to forget that in these types of meetings.

So I hope you enjoy our meetings for the coming year if you have a question or need help for a meeting please let me know, I am always happy to help out and show someone the ropes. (See my setup below.)
